Theme

Faithfulness becomes a habit when commitment becomes worship.

- Faithfulness is often quiet, unseen & repetitive'
- In caregiving, faithfulness becomes one of the clearest reflections of God's heart.
- Dementia caregiving especially requires showing up again & again, even when the person you love cannot remember, respond, or recognize.

Biblical Faithfulness

- Biblical faithfulness begins with who God is — constant, dependable, and unwavering.
- Because God is faithful, His people are called to reflect that same steady devotion.
- Faithfulness means keeping commitments even when feelings change.
- In Scripture, faithfulness is not driven by emotion but by covenant.

Biblical Faithfulness

- Faithfulness is the choice to honor promises, responsibilities & relationships even when circumstances shift or become difficult.
- It is consistent obedience expressed through daily actions.
- The Bible presents faithfulness as a pattern of small, repeated acts of obedience - showing up, serving, loving & doing what is right in the ordinary moments of life.

Biblical Faithfulness

- Faithfulness is empowered by the Holy Spirit, not human willpower.
- As a fruit of the Spirit, it grows in us as we stay connected to God.
- It is not self-manufactured but Spirit-produced.
- Faithfulness endures because it trusts God's promises & future reward.

- Biblical faithfulness perseveres through hardship because it believes God sees, God remembers & God rewards those who remain steadfast.

Faithfulness Reflects God's Steadfast Love

- God's faithfulness is the foundation for ours.
- We imitate His heart every time we show up with love, patience & presence.
- God is faithful in every season - His mercies meet us each morning, even on the hardest caregiving days.

*22 The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases; his mercies never come to an end; 23 they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness.
(Lamentations 3:22–23 ESV)*

Faithfulness Reflects God's Steadfast Love

- God keeps His promises - Our caregiving is anchored in a God who never changes.

13 Your kingdom is an everlasting kingdom, and your dominion endures throughout all generations. [The Lord is faithful in all his words and kind in all his works.] (Psalm 145:13 ESV)

Faithfulness Reflects God's Steadfast Love

- God never abandons His people - When we feel alone, He goes before us, stays beside us & carries us.

8 It is the Lord who goes before you. He will be with you; he will not leave you or forsake you. Do not fear or be dismayed.” (Deuteronomy 31:8 ESV)

Faithfulness Reflects God's Steadfast Love

- God strengthens the weary - Faithfulness doesn't come from our energy but from His renewing strength.

31 but they who wait for the Lord shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings like eagles; they shall run and not be weary; they shall walk and not faint. (Isaiah 40:31 ESV)

Faithfulness Reflects God's Steadfast Love

- God rewards perseverance - Every unseen act of love matters to Him.

36 For you have need of endurance, so that when you have done the will of God you may receive what is promised. (Hebrews 10:36 ESV)

- Caregiving faithfulness is not about perfection; it's about reflecting the God who keeps showing up for us.
- When we stay present with our loved one, even when we cannot respond, we mirror God's covenant love.

Faithfulness Shows Up in Daily Routines

- Faithfulness is not dramatic - It's steady.
- It's the quiet, repeated actions that build safety & trust.
- Consistent routines bring security.
- Predictability calms anxiety in dementia.
- Faithfulness means reliability in medications & appointments.
- These small acts protect dignity & health.

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Faithfulness Shows Up in Daily Routines

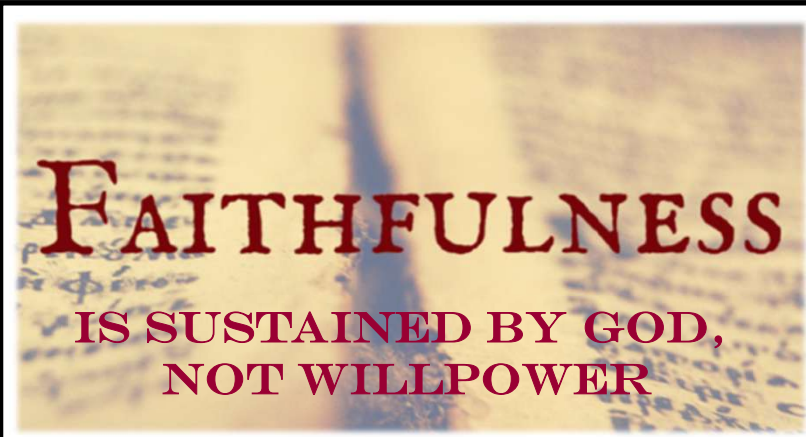
- Faithfulness includes emotional presence - A gentle tone, eye contact & touch communicate love beyond words.
- It continues even when unrecognized.
- God sees what our loved one cannot.
- Faithfulness reflects Christlike devotion.

Faithfulness Shows Up in Daily Routines

- Caregiving becomes a sacred stewardship.
2 Moreover, it is required of stewards that they be found faithful. (1 Corinthians 4:2 ESV)
- Our routines - brushing hair, preparing meals, redirecting confusion - are holy rhythms.
- They preach love louder than words.
- Even when unnoticed, they echo the faithfulness of Jesus.

Faithfulness Is Sustained by God, Not Willpower

- Caregivers often feel drained, stretched, or inadequate.
- God never intended us to carry this calling alone.
- He equips us for every task - God supplies what He asks of us.

(Hebrews 13:20–21)

Faithfulness Is Sustained by God, Not Willpower

*20 Now may the God of peace who brought again from the dead our Lord Jesus, the great shepherd of the sheep, by the blood of the eternal covenant, 21 equip you with everything good that you may do his will, working in us that which is pleasing in his sight, through Jesus Christ, to whom be glory forever and ever. Amen.
(Hebrews 13:20–21 ESV)*

Faithfulness Is Sustained by God, Not Willpower

- Faithfulness grows through prayer which keeps our heart soft & connected to God's strength.
- It is strengthened in community - Support groups, church family & friends help us endure.
- Faithfulness requires rest.
- Rest is not weakness - it is obedience.
- As a fruit of the Spirit, faithfulness flows from God's life in us, not our own effort.

- We are not the source of our faithfulness - God is.
- Our role is to stay connected to Him.
- He produces endurance, compassion & resilience in us day by day.
